Intent

At Dry Drayton C of E Primary School, our PSHE curriculum enables our children to become healthy, independent and responsible members of society. It aims to help them understand how they are developing personally and socially, and tackles many of the moral, social and cultural issues that are part of growing up today. We want them to leave primary school with the skills, resilience and knowledge that will keep them safe, happy and healthy. We place great importance on ensuring a comprehensive coverage of RSE and teaching pupils the value of self-respect and self-esteem. Promoting wellbeing and good mental health is also key to our approach and is an aspect of our children's development which we value greatly.
