Practice makes progress – at least one practice activity at home each week, but we will be revisiting weekly spellings regularly in school also.

Homework menu

Each term we provide a homework menu, to allow children to further explore the topics they are currently studying. This approach provides an opportunity for the children to really showcase their creativity. To support this, we will be hosting a termly exhibition opportunity during a Friday Sharing Collective Worship.

Children should strive towards a 'polished piece' of work that truly demonstrates their best effort and engagement.

English	The Tin Forest	Use recycled materials (tin can, cardboard, paper) to make a tin can house.
Art	William Morris	Create an illustrated artist fact file on William Morris
Science	Forces & Magnets	Carry out an investigation into magnetic and non-magnetic surfaces and materials in your home.
Spanish	Numbers 1-20, colours	Create a poster, showcasing your knowledge of numbers 1-20 and colours.
PSHE	Rules, rights & responsibilities	Be a royal ruler – what rules, rights or responsibilities would you introduce if you were king or queen of the world?
RE	Christianity, the Creation Story	Produce an illustration of the Christian creation story.

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Write each word and a word that rhymes with it	Spell your words using the magnetic letters	Write your words with a two - color pattern

At least one activity should be completed at home each week, in spelling books.

However, we would encourage children to practice weekly spellings as often as possible and will be following this approach in the classroom.

Children may even want to create their own practice techniques, such as writing vowels in a different colour, and then share this with the class.
